World Children's Day 2022

On Friday 18th November we will be taking part in UNICEF's World Children's Day. Children's Day is marked in November each year to promote international togetherness, awareness among children worldwide, and improving children's welfare. The UN General Assembly adopted the Declaration of the Rights of the Child on 20th November, 1959, and then 30 years later it adopted the Convention on the Rights of the Child on that same day. The convention, which is the most widely ratified international human rights treaty, lays out a number of children's rights including the "right to life, to health, to education and to play, as well as the right to family life, to be protected from violence, to not be discriminated against, and to have their views heard". All of our children from Nursery through to Year 2 are asked to wear blue on this non-uniform day and will take part in a range of exciting activities in class to mark this important event.

Parent Governor Vacancy

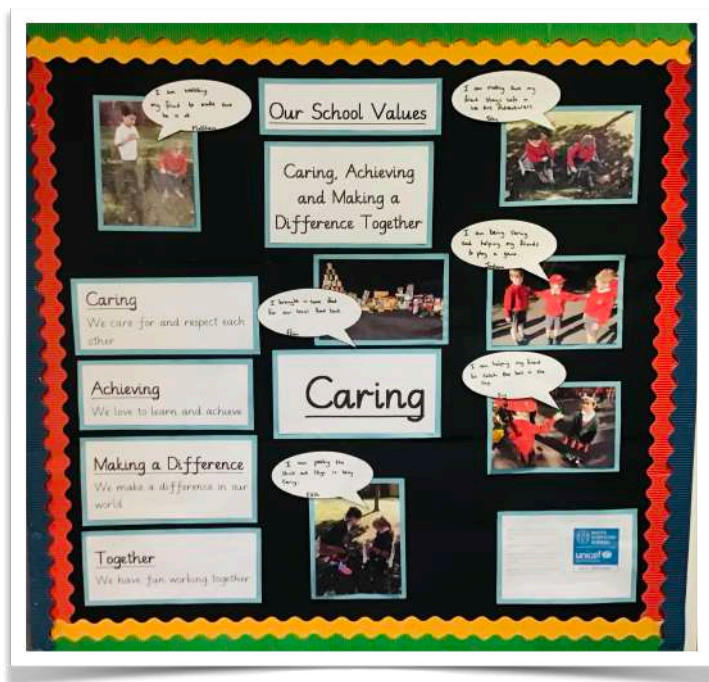

Tough Tortoise - who helps us to persevere and to keep going.





Wise Owl - who helps us to remember more and to think carefully about how to overcome obstacles in our learning.

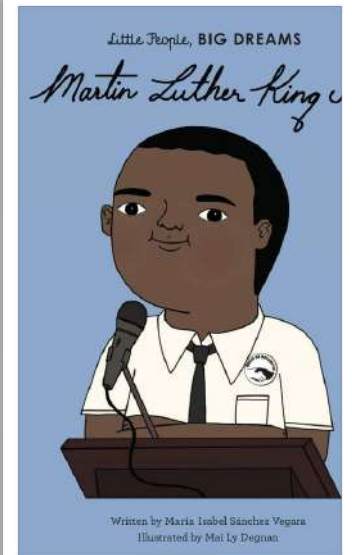
Respectful Racoon - who helps us with being respectful and caring towards others at all times.
