Sickness/ Diarrhoea



Hello Everyone.

Its' been a busy time since my last newsletter article in February. In my role as the governor responsible for curriculum, I visited school in July to see the wider curriculum in action. It was

a lovely afternoon, popping into classes to see Music, PE and PHSE being taught - and meeting children from Nursery up to Year 2. The children were so polite, welcoming and keen to talk about what they were learning.

I was back in school earlier this month to talk all things maths. I met with Mrs Wynne, the schools Maths Lead, who explained how maths is taught at Templemoor, and afterwards spoke with some children from Years 1 and 2. I was really impressed by their enthusiasm for maths and the links they made with how it's used in everyday life. Anti-Bullying Week

Here at Templemoor we are always proud to support Anti-Bullying Week, which took place this year in the week beginning 14th November. On Monday 14th November it was great to see the children (and some parents!) showing their commitment in wearing their odd socks to school to show their individuality and uniqueness. During the week the children participated in a range of activities to raise awareness of bullying. They also listened to a range of anti-bullying stories. The week was the perfect opportunity for the children to discuss their feelings and to offer support to one another. It was also important to recap the messages around bullying; to make sure that all of our children understand how to keep themselves safe, what to do if they are worried and how we will respond if they are ever worried or upset.

Here are some of our Year 1 children's views on bullying...

"Bullying is when someone is mean to you everyday. You need to tell a teacher and they will sort it out". *Harry*

"Bullying is really bad. A bully might push or trip you over or say mean things. You must tell a grown up if you are being bullied". Lucas

"Bullying is so unkind. It might make someone feel very sad". Emmie

Our Anti-Bullying Policy is available to view on our school website, along with a range of useful resources.

On Friday 18th November we took part in UNICEF's Universal Children's Day. Established by the United Nations in 1954, Children's Day is marked in November each year to promote international togetherness, awareness among children worldwide, and improving children's welfare. The UN General Assembly adopted the Declaration of the Rights of the Child on 20th November, 1959, and then 30 years later it adopted the Convention on the Rights of the Child on that same day. The convention, which is the most widely ratified international human rights treaty, lays out a number of children's rights including the "right to life, to health, to education and to play, as well as the right to family life, to be protected from violence, to not be discriminated against, and to have their views heard". All of our children from Nursery through to Year 2 wore blue and took part in a range of exciting activities in class to mark this important day.

Start of the School Day

Just a gentle reminder that classroom doors are open at 8:55am. Registration starts at 9am. The main gates and classroom doors are locked at 9am as children in Reception and Years 1 and 2 need to go straight into their phonics lessons. If you come to school after 9am you MUST come to the main office, and register your child using the electronic signing in system. Thank you for ensuring that your child gets to school on time.



Christmas Cards

Children love to be able to send Christmas cards to each other, so if your child would like to write and send some cards then please send these into school via your child's classroom. Please ensure the envelope has the full name and class of the recipient before handing them in to school!

Last year the staff at Templemoor didn't want parents to feel under pressure or worried about buying staff Christmas gifts when so many are struggling.
