Nursery Places




National Storytelling Week 2020

Happy New Year! It was a pleasure to meet Mrs



Handford earlier this month and discuss the school's continuing journey in educating our children about sustainability and environmental impact.

The school has already come a long way in the last year in raising awareness in both the children and their carers. Many of the children are very passionate about the subject and regularly remind their parents to make eco-friendly choices! Your children could probably tell you all about recycling as each classroom has a recycling station where they are responsible for recycling pens, pritt sticks, card, paper and food waste.

I'm sure you are all aware of the exciting eco-brick project too. Plans are underway to build a bench and planters in the playground. Please continue to send in more bricks particularly 2I (4 pint) milk bottles.

The school is reducing its use of single-use plasticthis includes: banning glitter and plastic straws. The Rights Respecting team meet regularly to discuss future plans to campaign to use glass milk bottles and to consider reducing plastic during lunchtimes. The aim is to reduce most single-use plastic by the end of the year.

At the Summer and Christmas fairs, I hope you visited Mrs Handford and Mrs Brown's eco stalls which demonstrated reusable craft ideas.

Templemoor are setting an excellent example and are encouraging a life-long passion for the planet as it is our children who will make a difference for the future. Water Bottles

Research tells us that many children do not drink enough water during the school day and that drinking adequate amounts of water regularly throughout the day can protect health, contribute to well-being and improve concentration and learning. To further promote the regular drinking of water and UNICEF Article 24, that 'Every child has the right to access clean water', children are encouraged to bring in their own water bottles each day. Please note that ONLY WATER IS ALLOWED IN WATER BOTTLES and that it is the children's responsibility to take their water bottles home each day to be refilled. Thank you for your continued support and co-operation in managing the practicalities of, and supporting, this healthy initiative.





World Book Day 2020


