Staff Training

Playing on the field before and after school

The play areas are for and about children. We are very happy that children enjoy playing for a little while before and after school. However staff will not be there to supervise so we ask that parents make sure that their child follows the playground rules which are necessary to ensure everyone's safety. Your child knows the rules - if in doubt please ask them.

Children can build with larger sticks and play with sticks which are about the length of their arm. These are to be played with only on the side of the Trim Trail where they are kept. Children must not take sticks home with them but can add to our collection at any time! No sticks are allowed in the willow igloos.

The large wooden climbing frame at the edge of the playground must not be climbed.

PLEASE LEAVE THE GROUNDS BY 3.45PM. on a Wednesday and Friday. (This is to ensure the safe supervision of children attending The X Club). PLEASE LEAVE THE GROUNDS BY 3.30PM. on a Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday. (This is to ensure the safe supervision of children attending our after school sports clubs). If your child does something which you think looks dangerous please talk to him/her about what might happen and what they could/should do to make themselves and others safe whilst at the same time enjoying the freedom we are offering. Thank you for your continued support.

That Poetry Bloke!

We love language and word play at Templemoor. So it will be no surprise to hear that teachers and children are looking forward to celebrating the joy of poetry on National Poetry Day, which is on Thursday 6th October. From sharing a poem with a friend to reading them aloud as a class, the whole school will rejoice with verse! Punctuality and Attendance

As ever, we are keeping a careful eye on attendance at school and working closely with our Education Welfare Officer. While we are pleased that our attendance rate is above the national expectations we always strive to do better and improve on the previous year. Please note that, in line with the Department for Education guidance on absence, requests for holidays in term time will not be granted. The guidance makes it clear that headteachers may not grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances. If your child is absent from school please let the office know before 9:30am and provide a written explanation on their return either in letter form or via email to admin@templemoor.trafford.sch.uk. Violins

The children in Year 2 are currently being taught music by specialist teachers from Trafford Music Service. They are learning to play the violin. The lessons will run each Monday for one term, finishing with a special concert in the school hall for parents and carers on Monday 5th December, time to be confirmed. Throughout the year all of the children in school will have the opportunity to be taught music by a specialist music teacher.

Year 1 Cake Sale

Our very first cake sale of this new academic year will take place on **Friday 7th October** when it will be the turn of our Year 1 children to bring in some delicious cakes to sell.

Year 1 and 2 Handwriting Information Evening

We will be holding a Handwriting Information Evening at school on Tuesday 18th October at 7pm for parents of children in Year One and Two. This session will last for approximately one hour. We will showcase our new scheme, Nelson Handwriting, and you will have the opportunity to discover the key benefits of the scheme to your child's learning; find out how you can support your child at home; and ask any questions you may have about handwriting. We very much hope you will attend and look forward to seeing you on the night.

PE in School


This year, we are investing some of our Sports Premium Money in the provision of a professional PE / Sports coach from 'The PE & Sports Hub'. Mr Garside will be working alongside teachers helping them to deliver high quality PE lessons. He will be working in school on a Tuesday and Thursday and will be working with every class throughout the year. He is also running several after school clubs this half term. During a lunchtime he will be working with Y2 children, training them up to become playground leaders. The PE Sports Hub also works in association with the Beth Tweddle Total Gymnastics Programme, so our children in Year 1 and 2 will be taught gymnastics by a qualified gym instructor.

The Golden Book

Every Friday each Year 1 and 2 teacher chooses two children in their class who have demonstrated exceptional effort, achievement, kindness etc. to be entered into the Golden Book. A special certificate is presented to the children whose names are put in the book. The children then have a delicious hot chocolate and marshmallows with Mr Hodgson. The Golden Book is kept in the school foyer. Take a look in the book the next time that you are in school to see just how hard all of our children have worked and how sensible and kind the children at Templemoor are. Children in Reception start to come into Golden Book Assembly in the Summer Term.



Some Gentle Reminders

Some gentle reminders for everyone's safety:

- Please do not bring dogs into the school grounds (tie them up at the gate).
- Please do not smoke in the school grounds.
- Always close gates behind you.
- If your child/ren come to school on bikes/ scooters they must dismount at the main gate, and walk the bike/scooter along through the pedestrian gate to the bicycle racks. Children must not scoot or ride around the playground at the beginning or end of the day.
- Football is not allowed in the playground at any time.

Pupil Premium

Please remember that even though children in Reception and Key Stage 1 receive Universal Free School Meals, we still need parents whose children are eligible for Pupil Premium Funding in all year groups to apply for the status of Free School Meals. This is extremely important as the school can get extra Pupil Premium funding of up to £1,320 per child per year if your joint family income is less than £16,190, and we can use this funding to provide additional opportunities for your child.
