We will continue to operate in much the same way as we have done in the Autumn term with year group and class bubbles, staggered drop off and collection arrangements and separate breaktimes. I would like to reassure you that we are taking every possible step in line with the government guidance to keep our whole school community safe. Our team are working incredibly hard to prepare for the children's return to school. They are doing an amazing job and I am very proud of their ongoing efforts. It really will be emotional to have everybody back again very soon... seven school days to go and counting!

I must say that your support during this time has been immense and we are so grateful that we have been able to pull together as a community during such a challenging time. Thank you.


Breakfast and After School Club


We are delighted to announce that X Club will be reopening from Monday 8^{th} March 2021. This is

Lockdown Restrictions Reminder

Please can we ask parents and carers to remember that we are still under strict national lockdown restrictions and will continue to be so even when the children return to school. Covid rates remain high. We must continue to follow the government's rules, which state 'You must not leave, or be outside of your home and garden, except for a very limited set of exemptions e.g. to shop for basic necessities, exercise, go to work if you cannot do so from home, or to escape risk of harm'. We have heard of children having sleepovers, playdates and visiting family and friends outside of their 'support bubbles'. Whilst we all appreciate how difficult this lockdown is for everyone, we must remember that not following national restrictions puts other children, parents and staff at risk. Thank you for your understanding and support in ensuring that our whole community remains safe.






Mental Health and Well Being

We are aware of the impact of the coronavirus pandemic on the anxiety levels of adults and children. Fears and worries are a normal part of child development and the content of fears change according to developmental stage. Anxiety disorders occur when the intensity of the fear or worry is so high that it starts to impact on the child's functioning and well-being and/ or when the anxiety is out of content with their developmental stage. If you are concerned about anxiety you may find the information **here** helpful.

Don't forget that simple techniques like breathing can help a great deal for children or adults feeling anxious. The app ChillPanda is especially good for calming down. We have a Mental Health and Well Being resource page on our school website where you can find a range of information on supporting your own and your child's mental health. This is being updated regularly so please do take a look. I hope that you find the resources useful.

Virtual Science Week

We had planned that next week in school was going to be Science week... and so rather than cancelling the event, we have decided that the show must go on, be it in a virtual form! The aim of the week is to focus on our children's knowledge and use of the scientific skills of enquiry and also to have fun experimenting, using things that can be found easily in the home. Our Science Lead, Mrs Leigh, along with Mrs Ree have recorded some great teaching videos of some simple



experiments that the children can attempt at home. There are five experiments for Early Years, and six experiments for Year 1 and Year 2. You will find these on next week's Remote Learning Platform under the tab 'Science Week'. You will also find an introductory video from Mrs Leigh explaining the purpose of Science week, teaching videos, powerpoints to go alongside the teaching videos and a list of useful science websites that you may like to access. It would be amazing if your child could have a go at some of the experiments. Please take as many photos/videos as you can and if you could send them in to Seesaw that would be wonderful! A huge thank you goes to Mrs Leigh and Mrs Ree for organising the virtual week. Happy investigating Templemoor!
