#### **Reception Christmas Performance**

Walking through school, it is just wonderful to hear the sound of singing coming from the hall and classrooms as the Reception children continue to rehearse for their Christmas Performance of 'A Miracle in Town'.

At this time, we are still aiming to invite an audience into the hall, and further details will follow in a separate letter. We will only be permitting 2 adults per family to watch the children perform. We would ask all adults attending to take a lateral flow test prior to arriving at school and to wear face masks during the performance. Parents in the Bees class will be invited to watch the show on Tuesday 7th December at 9:30am, and parents in the Ladybirds class will be invited to watch the show on Wednesday 8th December at 9:30am.

If Covid rates rise in the school, or if guidance from Trafford Public Health or the Department for Education suddenly changes, then we will have to change these plans, potentially at the last minute. In the event that a live show cannot go ahead, then we will aim to record the performance instead.

Parents in Nursery, Year 1 and Year 2 will also receive a separate letter next week detailing plans for their performances/assemblies. Thank you for your continued patience and understanding.

#### Wrapping up Warm

In line with government guidelines, we must have windows open to maintain airflow throughout the day. This means that, despite the heating, it can be slightly colder in class. We do not want your child to be cold so please ensure that they have a t-shirt or vest under their shirt, and a jumper with them every day. They must have a coat, even if the day seems mild as this can change by playtime and lunchtime. If your child tells you that they are cold, they are able to wear layers. We will not be asking children to wear coats in school as they need another layer to wear outside and often coats are wet from their journey to school and from playtime and lunchtime. We do have CO2 monitors in each class to monitor air flow and ventilation, and I am pleased to tell you that the air flow throughout every area of school is very good. Thank you for your continued support.

Children love to be able to send Christmas cards to each other, so if your child would like to write and send some cards then please send these into school via your child's classroom. Please ensure the envelope has the full name and class of the recipient before handing them in to school!

You may have heard the children in Years 1 and 2 talking about a 'Golden Table'. This is a really exciting reward initiative that we have just started to reintroduce here at Templemoor. Four children are chosen every Friday by our midday assistants to eat lunch at the 'Golden Table' with Mr Hodgson, in recognition of their good manners and outstanding behaviour in the dining hall and playground during the week. They have the privilege of a golden tablecloth, special trays and glasses, as well as decorations. The children chosen so far have thoroughly enjoyed their lunch and have felt very special.

#### Singing Club

We are delighted to announce the long awaited return of the fabulous Mrs Peacock and her amazing Singing Club in the new year. The Club will take place every Tuesday (starting on 11th January 2022) after school from 3:15pm to 4:30pm and will involve the children taking part in a range of musical activities and singing a range of songs. The children in Year 1 and 2 will also be taking part in a special singing assembly on Monday 6th December 2021, where Mrs Peacock will showcase some of the activities that will be taking place at the Club.

## Keeping Children Safe in School

The safety and well-being of children is paramount to all that we do at Templemoor. School policies and procedures are in place to ensure that all members of the school community can work together in a way that supports safeguarding for all. All policies relating to safeguarding are available on the school website. Hard copies of policies are kept in school and can be seen on request.



There are key members of staff who have responsibility for all safeguarding issues in the school. All concerns are reported to the Designated Safeguarding Lead, Mr Hodgson, (or Mrs Brown or Mrs Cundick in his absence) who has the responsibility of making sure that proper procedures are followed to address the concerns raised. However, all school staff do have a duty to report any concerns that they may have or anything brought to their attention by a child or another member of the school community. The School also has a safeguarding governor, Mrs Davenport, who comes into school regularly to ensure that all safeguarding policies, procedures and action plans are reviewed and updated. All staff have Safeguarding Training every year, as well as Prevent Training which deals with safeguarding against extremism and radicalisation. #### **Anti-Bullying Week**

Here at Templemoor we are always proud to support Anti-Bullying Week, which took place this year in the week beginning 15th November. On Monday 15th November it was great to see the children (and some parents!) showing their commitment in wearing their odd socks to school to show their individuality and uniqueness. During the week the children participated in a range of activities to raise awareness of bullying. They also listened to a range of anti-bullying stories. The week was the perfect opportunity for the children to discuss their feelings and to offer support to one another. It was also important to recap the messages around bullying; to make sure that all of our children understand how to keep themselves safe, what to do if they are worried and how we will respond if they are ever worried or upset.

Here are some of our Year 2 children's views on bullying...

"Bullying can hurt your feelings. If your friends are being bullied you need to stand up for them". *Eloise* 

"Bullying is really bad because it's mean and wrong. I would tell a grown up to make things better". Ella

"We listened and chatted about stories about bullying, and talked to our teachers about what to do if we are being bullied". *Alfie*  "Bullying is not very nice and you must always tell a grown up if you are worried about anything at all". Alex

#### **Proposed Templemoor Expansion**

Templemoor has recently been approached by the Local Authority as a preferred site for expansion from a two form to a three form entry infant school. With the proposed increase in children from 2023/2024 would come additional capital investment, with much needed improvements and exciting new facilities to further enhance the learning experience for our children now and those that follow in the future. I need to stress to you that the proposal is very much in its infancy, and will involve a long and rigorous process of consultation, including parent and resident consultation. Further details, once available, will be sent out in the new year with the whole school community being kept informed at every stage of the consultation process.
