As parents and carers you can now hopefully look forward to some level of resumed normality regarding the education of your children. Teachers will focus initially on settling the children back into school, ensuring that they are happy and secure. We will provide opportunities for play, collaboration, physical exercise and utilise our outdoor space as much as possible. We will prioritise identifying gaps and re-establishing good progress in phonics, reading, writing and mathematics. Our curriculum will remain broad and ambitious, with lots of wonderful crosscurricular learning. What some of the children at home may have lost is their willingness to be independent and the ability to problem-solve for themselves, as well as their stamina for sustained learning. Some children may be unsure at losing their 1:1 adult (you), having to work with others and remembering how to compromise. We will do all that we can to ensure that the children continue to develop these essential skills for learning.

As a school, we should be so proud of what we have achieved in unbelievably difficult circumstances. It has been a real testament to Templemoor as a community in the way that we have all pulled together to help and support one another. I really do look forward to seeing you all again on Monday 8th March.

Re-opening of School

You should have received a detailed letter via email, containing important information about the wider re-opening of school from 8th March. This letter can also be found via the following link. Up until at least the Easter holidays we will be implementing the stringent measures that were in place during the autumn term. This is following government guidance to keep us all safe. As the government has made clear, we are still in the midst of a pandemic and restrictions must remain in place until further notice. Everyone in our school community has worked so hard to keep one another safe. Thank you for maintaining your commitment to this, despite the challenges of having to do so for such a prolonged period of time.

Lateral Flow Tests for Households

The government are now providing lateral flow testing kits to households, childcare and support bubbles of primary age pupils. About 1 in 3 people with Coronavirus do not have symptoms but can still pass it on to others. Regular testing of people without symptoms is important to help stop the virus spreading and protect loved ones. As lockdown restrictions gradually ease we all need to play our part to help protect each other. From 1st March 2021, if you're a member of a household, childcare bubble or support bubble of a pupil you can get a twice-weekly test via:

- your employer if they offer testing to employees.
- at a local test site.

- by collecting a home test kit from a test site (You can collect up to 2 home test kits at a local collection point. Each kit contains 7 tests. You can check online if the location is busy before you go. Click on the following link to see where your nearest test site is.
- by ordering a home test kit online (This online service is available via the following **link**).

Please also ensure that only 1 adult brings or collects their child or children. Thank you for your continued support.

Staying Safe

Please do not send your child in to school if they develop Covid-19 symptoms:

- A raised temperature
- A new continuous cough
- A loss or change to the sense of smell or taste

Children may return to school once a negative test has been obtained or after 10 days from the onset of symptoms. Children should also not come to school if:

- They have been in close contact with someone who tests positive for Covid-19.
- Anyone in their household or support or childcare bubble develops symptoms of Covid-19.
- They have been advised to isolate by NHS test and trace or the PHE local health protection team, which is a legal obligation

Wellbeing
