close on Thursday 20th December 2018. Thank you in advance for your time.


Start of the School Day

Just a gentle reminder that classroom doors are open at 8:50am. Registration starts at 8:55am. Classroom doors are then locked at 9am as children in Years 1 and 2 need to go straight into their Phonics Lessons. If you come to school after 9am you MUST come to the main office, and register your child in the late book. Thank you for ensuring that your children get to school on time.

Remembrance Day 2018

This year marked the commemoration of 100 years since the end of World War One. As a school we felt that it was vitally important to mark this symbolic event with the children. The children found out about Remembrance day itself. They thought about what we remember and why people wear poppies as a sign of respect and to help remember all of the soldiers who fought in the war. The children have created some beautiful poppy art pieces and have produced some thoughtful written work that we have displayed in the main entrance.





Sickness/ Diarrhoea

If your child has had sickness or diarrhoea they are not allowed to return to school until **48 hours** following the last bout. If you bring your child into school before this time you will be asked to take them home immediately. This policy will be strictly adhered to as we are trying to prevent these bugs from spreading. 
Easyfundraising

Universal Children's Day 2018

On Tuesday 20th November we took part in UNICEF's Universal Children's Day. Established by the United Nations in 1954, Children's Day is marked on November 20th each year to promote international togetherness, awareness among children worldwide, and improving children's welfare. The UN General Assembly adopted the Declaration of the Rights of the Child on 20th November, 1959, and then 30 years later it adopted the Convention on the Rights of the Child on that same day. The convention, which is the most widely ratified international human rights treaty, lays out a number of children's rights including the "right to life, to health, to education and to play, as well as the right to family life, to be protected from violence, to not be discriminated against, and to have their views heard". All of our children from Nursery through to Year 2 wore blue and took

part in a range of exciting activities in class to mark this important day.


Word of the Fortnight

The Templemoor Mile

Since half term, each class has been taking part in The Templemoor Mile. It's a social activity where the children run, jog or walk at their own pace, for 15 minutes in the playground in their normal school clothes and shoes. It is a fully-inclusive and simple initiative which has proven to improve the physical and mental health of children. The Daily Mile now takes place in over 3600 primary schools and in over 35 countries around the world and the children (and staff!) really do love it!

Singing Club Concert

Our Singing Club is made up of children from Year 1 and Year 2 and is led by Mrs Peacock, a teacher from Trafford Music Service. Singing Club meets every Tuesday after school and enthusiastically learn a range of songs. This week we were lucky enough to listen to our wonderful children singing the songs that they have been learning. The children certainly knew how to fill the hall with song and sang in perfect harmony. Well done children!

Year 2 Ukulele Concert

This term all of the children in Year 2 have been learning how to play the ukulele. The children have learnt how to look after their instruments as well as how to strum notes and play simple songs. At the end of the project the children performed in an

amazing concert, which demonstrated their hard work and commitment to learning an instrument. Thank you to Mrs Peacock who taught the children so much, but a huge well done to all of our Year 2 children who showed a great level of commitment and enjoyed this fantastic opportunity to learn a musical instrument.

The children in Reception have been having a very exciting time learning about Autumn. They were lucky to have a visit from three wise old owls and a buzzard too! Ian, from Lower Moss Wood Education Nature Reserve and Wildlife Hospital in Knutsford, came to talk to the children about owls. He introduced a barn owl called Shimba, a tawny owl called Oatie and an Eagle owl called Chocolate. Ian answered questions that the children themselves had thought of and was thrilled with how interested the children were in these fabulous birds.



Keeping Children Safe in School

The safety and well-being of children is paramount to all that we do at Templemoor. School policies and procedures are in place to ensure that all members of the school community can work together in a way that supports safeguarding for all. All policies relating to safeguarding are available on the school website. Hard copies of policies are kept in school and can be seen on request



There are key members staff who have responsibility for all safeguarding issues in the school. All concerns are reported to the Designated Safeguarding Lead, Mr Hodgson, (or Mrs Brown or Mrs Cundick in his absence) who has the responsibility of making sure that proper procedures are followed to address the concerns raised. However, all school staff do have a duty to report any concerns that they may have or anything brought to their attention by a child or another member of the school community. The School also has a safeguarding governor, Mrs Davenport, who comes into school regularly to ensure that all safeguarding policies, procedures and action plans are reviewed and updated. All staff have Safeguarding Training every year, as well as Prevent Training which deals with safeguarding against extremism and radicalisation. If you have any questions or comments to make about any aspect of safeguarding we are more than happy to hear from you. Please feel free to contact the school office.

Lost Property

We have rather a large amount of lost property that has accumulated in school. Please make sure your children's belongings are named - it does not make them any more difficult to lose but it does make it much easier for them to be returned to their rightful owner! If you think your child may have left something in school please encourage them to look for it.



Parking

Please could I ask all parents who need to bring a car to school to park appropriately and **not** on

Nursery Close. We have had a number of recent calls from residents who have complained that cars have been blocking driveways and pavements. Nursery Close is not a suitable place to park your car. Please respect the school's request to park on Temple Road instead. The staff car park is for staff use only and must not be used by parents for parking or turning. There have also been reports of parents parking their cars on pavements and then narrowly avoiding children who are walking on the pavement, as well as parents leaving their engines running whilst stationary (known as engine idling) which is particularly bad for the environment as well as it being a potentially fineable offence. Please help and support us in eliminating the dangers and set a good example to your children. Thank you.
