
Happy Holidays!

This workshop will give an insight about issues children can face when using the internet and ideas on how families can work together to combat any problems which arise. The workshop will look at:

- What is your responsibility as a parent?
- Practical advice regarding parental controls to filter and monitor content
- Fun ways to keep your child safe online

The workshop will be delivered by Nicola Graham and Jan Radcliffe from Safer Children Ltd. Nicola Graham is a retired Detective Constable, having served 30 years for Greater Manchester Police in the Trafford area. The last 19 years have been spent working in a multi-agency environment within the public protection/family support unit the last 10 years as a dedicated child abuse detective within the unit. Jan Ratcliffe has 25 years' teaching experience with a number of those years spent in charge of safeguarding and child protection as part of her role as a Deputy Headteacher within Trafford. Please note that school will be closed on **Friday 7**th **February 2020** for staff training. You must make suitable arrangements for your child on this day. Thank you.


Procedure to follow when a child is absent
