Ian answered questions that the children themselves had thought of and was thrilled with how interested they all were in these fabulous birds. In line with government guidelines, we must have windows open to maintain airflow throughout the day. This means that, despite the heating, it can be colder in class. We do not want your child to be cold so please ensure that they have a t-shirt or vest under their shirt, and a jumper with them every day. They must have a coat, even if the day seems mild as this can change by playtime and lunchtime. If your child tells you that they are cold, they are able to wear layers. We will not be asking children to wear coats in school as they need another layer to wear outside and often coats are wet from their journey to school and from playtime and lunchtime. Anti-Bullying Week

The 16th November to 20th November 2020 was Anti-Bullying Week and the main focus this year was 'united against bullying.' Here at Templemoor we are always proud to support Anti-Bullying Week. On Monday 16th November it was lovely to see the children (and parents!) showing their commitment in wearing their odd socks to school to show their individuality and uniqueness. During the week the children participated in a range of activities to raise awareness of bullying. They also listened to a range of anti-bullying stories many of which can still be accessed on our **Templemoor Story Time** channel. The week was a wonderful opportunity for the children to discuss their feelings and to offer support to one another. It was also important to recap the messages around bullying; to make sure that all of our children understand how to keep themselves safe, what to do if they are worried and how we will respond if they are ever worried or upset.

Here are some of our Year 2 children's views on bullying...

"Bullying is mean and unkind. It can really hurt peoples feelings". Beatrice.





"Bullying makes you feel upset and very sad. If someone is bullying you, you must tell a teacher or a grown up straight away". *Elliott*.

"Bullying is wrong and can make you feel sad and uncomfortable and can really hurt your heart". *Eric.*

Christmas Cards and Gifts

To ensure we keep the risk of Covid transmission to a minimum we will not be sharing Christmas cards this year and politely request that children do not bring any cards to school. We know that some will be disappointed about this but there are others who have told us that it is a relief not to worry about cards coming home. We would also ask that children don't bring in gifts for the staff for the same reasons.

We are always amazed at the generosity of our parents, and our staff are so grateful for the support from you all, but this pandemic has clearly brought with it increased difficulty and uncertainty for many people in every community. We are also well aware that we haven't had the opportunities this year to support our local charities. As you know we would normally have Toast Tuesdays, Wednesday Warmers, Food Bank collections, donations at our Christmas performances etc. Our staff feel it wouldn't be appropriate for us to accept gifts at this time when so many are struggling.

However, If parents would like to donate to a local food bank, a favourite charity, or to our chosen charity, 'Crisis at Christmas' (<u>crisis.org.uk</u>), we would very much appreciate it and it would really



make us all smile. If you do decide to make a donation, please do let us know. Thanks again for your understanding and generosity.

World Children's Day

On Friday 20th November we took part in UNICEF's Universal Children's Day. Established by the United Nations in 1954, Children's Day is marked on November 20th each year to promote international togetherness, awareness among children worldwide, and improving children's welfare. The UN General Assembly adopted the Declaration of the Rights of the Child on 20th November, 1959, and then 30 years later it adopted the Convention on the Rights of the Child on that same day. The convention, which is the most widely ratified international human rights treaty, lays out a number of children's rights including the "right to life, to health, to education and to play, as well as the right to family life, to be protected from violence, to not be discriminated against, and to have their views heard". All of our children from Nursery through to Year 2 wore blue and took part in a range of exciting activities in class to mark this important day.

COVID Secure Procedures

As the government have now placed Trafford back into Tier 3, the 'very high alert' category we thought it would be useful to issue a few gentle reminders.

- Please stick to your pick up and drop off time.
- Only ONE adult per family must drop off and collect. This is so that we reduce the number of people on the school site.
- When entering the school gates please ensure that you social distance between your family bubble and the next family bubble.
- It is important that your children are supervised and remain with you at all times.
- When dropping or collecting your children we ask that parents leave promptly to reduce congestion.
- If you or a member of your household have Covid symptoms, you must all isolate, whilst they get tested, and let us know at the earliest possible point of the result (even during the weekend), so we can minimise the impact on anyone else in school.
- In addition we all need to remember to wash our hands regularly.

You are all doing a tremendous job. Please keep going - It really is thanks to your vigilance and our enhanced protective measures in school, that we've managed to have twelve full weeks back with no disruption. Well done!
