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But if you don’t have access to this or you would like a change you could: Keep looking at your speed sounds. Can you time yourself, how many sounds can you say correctly in 1 minute. Time yourself each day? Can you beat your previous results? Can you make cards for the set 2 sounds you have learnt and add them to your set of cards?																			
Remember try to do phonics for a short time every day.																			
Reading	<u>Words in the environment</u> . With an adult look through your kitchen cupboards and find some food packages e.g. tins and																		

	<p>packets. How many labels can you read? Can you spot any special friends in the words e.g. <u>We</u>etabix, <u>hoo</u>ps, pasta, <u>ch</u>opped, <u>bro</u>th</p>
Writing	<p>When travelling you often have to pack food to take with you. Can you write a list of foods to take on a picnic? If you are lucky you may be able to make a picnic and take it in the garden or into a different room in your house.</p> <p>Handwriting – to develop handwriting skills you need to have good gross motor skills and fine motor skills. For fine motor skills you can play with play dough (recipe on home learning page) or thread beads or pasta tubes or cereal loops on to string or wool. For gross motor skills you could throw and catch a ball or balloon and/or try to balance on one leg!</p>
Mathematics	<p><u>Numbers in the environment</u></p> <p>Go for a walk and look for numbers in the environment. Can you say all the numbers? Can you record any numbers? Do you notice any patterns in the numbers? E.g. odd or even on houses, numbers at the end of car reg.</p> <p>White Rose Home Learning: https://whiterosemaths.com/homelearning/early-years/</p> <p>On the White Rose website you will need to access - Early Years, Summer Term – Week 4. ‘The Very Busy Spider’ by Eric Carle. Project Work	<p>Let’s look closely at ‘Hot Air Balloons’.</p> <p>Do you know anything about hot air balloons or can you find out about hot air balloons? Log in to Espresso and search for ‘Balloon Festival’. Watch the video.</p> <p>Hot air balloon can be really colourful and lots of fun shapes. Can you draw a design for a hot air balloon in your home learning books or on paper?</p> <p>If you have a balloon you could try some ‘Papier Mache’ with newspaper and make your own model of a hot air balloon. https://www.bbcgoodfood.com/howto/guide/how-make-papier-mache</p> <p>Tell an adult or record in sentences these questions:</p>

	<p>If you could float away in a hot air balloon, where would you go? Would you take a picnic? Who would you take with you?</p>
Online Learning	<p>Purple Mash: look on the 'to do' list and complete task. Although you may do additional activities, the Maths games are always good fun!</p> <p>Mathletics: Continue to work on tasks set but you can do more activities if you wish.</p> <p>Espresso: Have fun exploring the Foundation stage activities.</p>

On the home learning part of the school website you will find all of the resources you will need: 'acts of wildness cards' and 'calendar wall chart'.
