

# **International Dot Day**



# Attendance

We continue to carefully monitor attendance at school and work closely with our Education Welfare Officer. We are pleased that our attendance rate is above national expectations, yet we always strive to do better and improve on the previous year. In line with the Department for Education guidance on absence, requests for holidays in term time will not be granted. The guidance makes it clear that headteachers may not grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances. If your child is absent from school please let the office know before 9am. Please confirm the reason for the absence i.e. flu, upset stomach etc. For further information, our Attendance and Punctuality Policy can be found on our website.

# Safeguarding

It is the duty of all of us to make sure our children are safe, protected from harm and happy both in and out of school. If we notice any concerns in school, we have a duty to report these to Trafford Children First Response. If you notice anything at all that concerns you, please do not hesitate to speak to us. Our designated lead for safeguarding is Mr Hodgson, our deputy designated leads are Mrs Brown and Mrs Cundick and our safeguarding governor is Mrs Davenport. # Water Bottles

We all know the importance of keeping ourselves well hydrated throughout the day - it keeps us healthy and allows our brains to function well. We would like all children to bring in a water bottle from home each day filled with water. As the footballer Ronaldo says, we should be drinking water as it is far healthier for our bodies than sugary drinks. We are also very concerned about the impact of sugary drinks on children's teeth when they are drinking them throughout the day. To keep children's teeth healthy, our school policy is for children to drink **water only** from their bottles during lesson times. Please help us to preserve our children's healthy smiles by sending your child to school with water in their bottle.

# Punctuality

Although the majority of our parents are excellent at bringing their children to school on time, there are still children arriving later than 9am. Registration runs from **8:50am** to **9am**. At 9am the school gates will be locked. Children coming to school after 9am are actually late and will be marked as so. This will show on your child's attendance record so please ensure your child arrives at school on time. Arriving late does have an impact on your child's start to the day. This also impacts on the rest of their class due to the disruption it causes. Please support school by arriving at school on time. Thank you for your help with this.

# **Covid Updates**

You will note from the press that Covid cases are creeping up. Public Health have advised us this week that Trafford now has the third highest Covid rate across Greater Manchester with increasing cases in 5-15 year olds. Although we have less cases than many schools, we are seeing isolated incidents in some classes. We therefore need to remain vigilant to keep you, your child and our school safe. Please remember the rules regarding attendance at school.

- If your child displays Covid symptoms, they must stay at home and get a PCR test. This includes a new and continuous cough, a high temperature and/or a loss of sense of smell or taste. A lateral flow test is not sufficient if your child has any of the above symptoms. They must isolate and you must book a PCR test for them. You can book one <u>here</u>.
- Under new guidance issued this week from Trafford Public Health, children aged between the ages of 5 and 16, are now advised to stay at home when a sibling or household member tests positive for Covid-19 (via either a PCR or Lateral Flow test). On day 2/3 following the onset of symptoms in the household (or test date if the



positive case had no symptoms), the close contact child should get a PCR test. If this is negative, they can return to school, but should isolate again immediately and get another test if they develop symptoms of Covid-19 at a later date.

 Any parents or carers who still want their child to continue to attend school have the right to send their child into the setting. In these situations, we strongly advise the precautions as described above should be taken but we recognise that this cannot be enforced. Thank you for your support in keeping our school community safe.
