Staying Safe Online

One of the positives which has come from Covid is the fact that we are all using technology we hadn't even heard of last year! From Zoom to Teams, uploading and downloading content and communicating with friends and family online has become the way of the world. Whilst the majority of this is hugely beneficial and positive, there are



always the negative aspects of the internet and we would urge you to ensure your family is safe at home. Please check over your internet settings to ensure the appropriate filters are on and double check that these apply to all devices that children have access to. If children are using devices which do not have the filters (such as an adult's personal phone or tablet) please supervise them so you know what they are accessing. Often (and slightly embarrassingly for us!) the children know more about the internet than we do and they are quite proficient in navigating it so if you do need any extra help, the NSPCC has some great advice about not only the practicals of what to do, but how to support your children if issues do arise. Reporting Cases over the Holiday Period

You may be aware that last week the Department for Education (DfE) instructed all schools that they will have to be on Covid Test and Trace Duty for 6 days after term has ended. The reason the DfE needs us to be on Test and Trace Duty is so we can contact anyone who had close contact with a positive case, if their symptoms appeared in the first weekend of the holidays. These close contacts will have to self-isolate for 10 days, and, as test results can be delayed, the Duty has to be for 6 days after the end of term. We will therefore contact you via text and email if your child has been a 'close contact' to a positive case and unfortunately your child will have to self-isolate for 10 days. A letter detailing the reporting arrangements was sent out to all parents yesterday.

Starting the new term in January 2021

Covid Risk Assessment

Due to the current national situation, school will continue to run in the same way after Christmas, in terms of staggered starts and bubbles. Our whole school Covid Risk Assessment is updated regularly, and can be found on our school website. One change that has been made to the Risk Assessment this week is the fact that the period of self-isolation for Covid contacts has been reduced from 14 days to 10 days to reflect government policy.

Virtual Parent Consultations

Despite a small handful of tiny technical issues, our virtual parent consultations went well, and we have received some very positive feedback from parents. This was of course our very first time of running these meetings, and I do understand that some parents would have liked longer to talk to their child's class teacher. There will be further consultations next term, and fingers crossed we can return to face to face consultations in the not too distant future.

Year 2 Phonic Screening Check

Well done to all of our children in Year Two, who have completed their phonics check recently. We are very proud of every single one of the children. They all showed great determination to do their very best. It was brilliant watching them using their Fred fingers and their sounding out skills during their assessments - well done to everyone who took part in the test. 98.3% of children passed the test, which is a remarkable achievement.

As we approach the end of the autumn term, I would like to wish each and every one of our families an enjoyable, restful and safe Christmas. I am sure that your children will return refreshed and eager to be back at Templemoor to continue their learning journey when school reopens on Monday 4th January 2021.
