

Going back to the phrase, 'not all superheroes wear capes', I cannot thank our Templemoor team enough for the work that they have been doing this half term. As you can imagine, planning the curriculum content remotely for such young learners is incredibly complex. Staff have simultaneously managed the needs of learners children in school and remotely, monitoring class email and Seesaw messages, and often working long into the evening and much of the weekend. The staff team, have shown such dedication to continually learning, adapting, improving and enhancing the way in which they plan for and deliver learning. They have had to manage the regular changes in guidance and requirements from Government, usually at very short notice. Throughout all of this, they have had to work with their own anxieties about the virus, under a rigorous risk assessment which requires constant focus on safety and hygiene in the school building, as well as look after and care for their own families too. Remote Learning Platform

This week we have launched a new remote learning platform for children and parents in Year 1 and Year 2, with the aim of streamlining resources and making them more accessible. We really do hope that you find this platform easier to use than the website. Feedback so far has been really positive. Please note that from next week we will only be using the new platforms to upload resources etc., and will not be putting these resources onto the school website. We will only continue to use the school website for Nursery and Reception remote learning.

Rapid Lateral Flow Test Update

Lateral flow testing for school staff started last week. We have been asked to do this to limit the spread of coronavirus in the community, as it will pick up any asymptomatic cases (currently estimated to be 1 in 3 people who are infected but do not have any symptoms). We hope that all results will continue to come back as negative. If any results come back positive, we will have to close a bubble with immediate effect. As staff are taking the tests first thing in the morning (in line with the Public Health advice that we have received), this closure would only happen at very short notice. Please continue to check your texts and emails each morning before you set off for school - just in case. Closed bubbles would switch to remote learning, which is already in place via the school website/ remote learning platform. Thank you all for your support and understanding during these trying times.
