





Reporting Covid Cases over Half-Term

The Department for Education (DfE) instructed all schools that they will have to be on Covid Test and Trace duty during the first few days of the half-term holiday. The reason the DfE needs us to be on Test and Trace duty is so we can contact anyone who has had close contact with a positive case, if their symptoms appeared in the first weekend of the holidays. If your child has been in school this week, and they do develop Covid symptoms and have a positive Covid test before Tuesday 16th February, then you must email school via admin@templemoor.trafford.sch.uk so that we can advise affected children and staff to self-isolate for 10 days. Lateral Flow testing of staff will continue over the holiday period.


The Great Big Art Exhibition
