Phonics		<p>Keep looking at those speed cards daily. Write a list of words for each sound of the day? The sound can be at the start, middle or end of a word. At the end of the week: which sound was the most tricky to find words? Which sound did you write the most words?</p> <p>Can you write some red words? 		<p>If you feel that your child is confident with all set 1, 2 and 3 sounds you could watch 'Read Longer Words' but they do need to know all sounds confidently.</p> <p>Complete 'Read and hold a sentence'. This will help with writing so children need to be sat at a table and have writing materials available to them. Choose the green book option. Also 'Read Red Words 1' would be helpful to watch for a change too. 'Read Longer Words', 'Read and Hold a Sentence' and 'Read Red Words 1' can all be found on the Read, Write, Inc you tube channel (just click on the link above).</p>		
Reading		<p>Please sign in to Oxford Owls free e-books age 4-5.</p> <p>Look at RWinc. Purple Book 1 – Run, run, run</p> <p>Please read this book every day. Can you answer the questions on page 14? Look at the speedy word chart. How many times can you read it in a minute? Are you faster at the end of the week?</p> <p>Please let us know how you read it; was it hard or easy?</p> <p>Remember nothing beats just sharing a story together!</p>		
Writing		<p>Can you write about your favourite mini beast? This week we would like you really try to write a sentence on your own. It is important to try and write on the line. Remember your capital letter, finger spaces and full stop. (Remember your Fred fingers for spelling) but if you are not sure have a go or ask an adult for the spelling.</p> <p>E.g. I like butterflies because they are colourful.</p> <p><u>Handwriting</u></p> <p>Please complete 2 to 4 pages again this week. It is more important to do 2 well than 4 rushed. So take your time sit comfortably at a table, hold your pencil correctly and try to be neat. You can always continue to practise the same sounds/numbers on a separate sheet of lined paper. Start to try to sit letters on a line and try to control the size of the writing.</p>

		<p>break up a week earlier than us as they only have one week at the end of May.</p> <p>The story this week is 'Zog' by Julia Donaldson. They continue to look at pattern, positional language, addition and subtraction with numbers to 20, mathematical language; first, second, third etc., ordering numbers to 20, size words and measurement. If you haven't got this story you can still do the activities but you can watch on the link below to give the activities more purpose.</p> <p>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=qZqFqIOMAfU</p> <p>Maths without a screen: You could try drawing 10 worms and order them by numbering 1 for the longest and 10 for the shortest. Encourage the children to use the correct mathematical language to describe position and size.</p>
Project Work		<p>Our topic this half term is 'Why do Ladybirds have spots?'</p> <p>This week we are going to look at the word 'camouflage'. Many mini beasts are very good at camouflage to help them survive. Maybe you could find some images of insects camouflaged.</p> <p>Can you find out about stick insects, or any other mini beasts that have developed so they are difficult to spot e.g. shield bugs, snails, caterpillars, grass-hoppers?</p> <p>We talked last week about where we find mini beasts.
