### Rights Respecting School



### School Outcomes for 2017/18


At the start of our new academic year it is always good to celebrate our children's academic achievements from last year. We now have outcomes from the end of Early Years, the Year 1 Phonic Screening Check and from the end of Year 2. Our performance data is on our website, under the tab 'Our School', 'School Performance'.

Our children at Templemoor continue to have excellent outcomes. Please find attached at the end of this newsletter the full 2018 performance data for Templemoor Infant and Nursery School for the end of Year 2. Well done to our families for their support, thanks to the amazing and dedicated staff team....but most importantly well done to our brilliant children for their positive attitude, hard work and 'I can do it attitude'.

### School Outcomes for EYFS and Year 1

81.7% of pupils in Reception attained a Good Level of Development against the Early Years framework. The national average is 71.5%, and the Trafford average is 75.3%. A Good Level of Development is defined as children working at the expected standard or exceeding the expected standard in the key areas of literacy, maths, physical development, communication and language and personal, social and emotional development.

98.3% of children in Year One attained the expected standard in the Phonic Screening test. This is above the national average of 82.6%, and the Trafford average of 86.3%.

Expected Standard - Working at the expected standard for a child at the end of Year 2.

Greater Depth - Working at greater depth within the expected standard, with a strong understanding of the curriculum.
